



Privacy Statement

- We collect personal information about you, including your name, address, and your involvement – as an offender or victim – in a specific criminal offence. This is to enable us to deliver restorative justice.
- None of this information must be provided by you; restorative justice is a voluntary process, and you are under no obligation to take part.
- Only the final Restorative Justice Conference Report will be shared. Copies will be sent to the victim, the offender, the Court, the offender’s lawyer, and the Police. (A copy may be sent to Corrections (Probation) with the permission of the offender)
- We keep your information safe by only allowing authorized people to access it.
- After three years, all digital information is securely wiped, and all written information securely destroyed.
- You have the right to ask for a copy of any personal information we hold about you, and to ask for it to be corrected if you think it is wrong. If you would like a copy of your information, or wish to have it corrected, please contact us at the address below.
- Any concerns about your rights under the Privacy Act 2020 should be addressed to the Manager of the Manawatū Restorative Justice Trust who is the designated Privacy Officer.
